Conscious Planet-Save Soil initiative is a global movement launched by Sadhguru and Isha Foundation to bring awareness about soil degradation and advocate for policies to safeguard soil health across all nations. important work in India, supporting vaccine production and clean energy initiatives.

"I am glad that we are renewing the Indo-US Vaccine Action Programme," he said.

"There is so much that our countries can and will do together. I am committed to make the US-India partnership among the closest we have on earth," Biden said.

On the issue of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the US President said that the two leaders also discussed the ongoing effects of Russia's brutal and non-justified invasion of Ukraine and the effect it has on the entire global world order.

"The US-India is going to continue consulting closely on

how to mitigate these negative effects," Biden said.

FREE RATION FOR MARGINALIZED

It was during the first wave of COVID that PM Modi announced free ration for the marginalized section of society. The scheme was then extended during the second wave and was extended for another six months till March 2022. Through this scheme, 80 crore beneficiaries were given free ration each month.

WORLD'S LARGEST VACCINATION DRIVE

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government launched the nationwide vaccination programme in the tough times of

Through this scheme, Rs, 6,000 is directly transferred to the bank account of farmers in three instalments of Rs 2,000 per year. The 11th instalment will be transferred to farmers on May 31 in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Shimla.

FARM LAWS WITHDRAWN

Notably, the government has also withdrawn the controversial farm laws as a mark of gesture and respect for the farmers. The Prime Minister said that it was unfortunate that he was not able to explain the benefit of reforms to the farmers.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Geetanjali Shree Becomes First Indian Author to Win International Booker Prize

Indian author Geetanjali Shree has won the International Booker Prize -- making her the first writer from the South Asian nation to claim the prestigious literary award. Shree's winning novel, "Tomb of Sand," follows an 80-year-old woman as she gains a new lease on life following the death of her husband. Set in the shadow of the 1947 partition of India, Shree explores themes of trauma, motherhood and feminism.

Translated from Hindi to English by Daisy Rockwell, the book is the first in an Indian language to win the award, which recognizes fiction translated into English and published in the United Kingdom or Ireland.

The International Booker Prize is separate from the Booker Prize, which is awarded to novels written in English. In 1997, Indian author Arundhati Roy became the first Indian to win the Booker Prize

for her novel, "The God of Small Things." Shree and American translator Rockwell will split the £50,000 (\$63,000) prize money.

"I never dreamed of the Booker, I never thought I could," Shree said during her acceptance speech in London on Thursday. "What a huge recognition. I am amazed, delighted, honored and humbled."

The chair of judges, Frank Wynne, said the book has "an exuberance and a life, a power and a passion, which the world could do with right now."

"This is a luminous novel of India and partition, but one whose spellbinding brio and fierce compassion weaves youth and age, male and female, family and nation into a kaleidoscopic whole," Wynne said. Writer, critic and broadcaster, Viv Groskop, called it "a real masterclass in narrative, in exploring identity and a brilliant look at family relationships."

Born in 1957 in the northern

state of Uttar Pradesh, Shree has written three novels and several short story collections. Her work has been translated into English, French, German, Serbian and Korean. "Tomb of Sand" is the first of her books to be published in the UK. Rockwell called it "one of the most difficult" works she has ever translated because of the "experimental nature of Geetanjali's writing" and "unique use of language."

Shree said her recognition "brings into larger purview the entire world of Hindi literature" and in particular, "Indian literature as a whole."

"It also brings into view the fact that there is a vast world of literature with rich lineages which still needs to be discovered," she said in an interview on the Booker Prize website. "I am pleased and humbled to be the conduit for this."

Business is not easy, but you need to have determination: KV Kumar

President and CEO of the Indian American International Chamber of Commerce, IAICC, K.V. Kumar, in an interview May 19, 2022, with ITV Gold host Nidhi Kathuria, addressed challenges for small businesses in the U.S. and his role in U.S.-India relations.

Kumar is Chairman of KMF Investment Group, a company that invests in start-ups, small businesses in nano-technology, healthcare and other fields.

“KV” as he is more popularly known, has been engaged in volunteer and mentoring for more than 16 years working with small businesses, entrepreneurs, people with brain injury, youth and community organizations. He has served 6 U.S. Presidents in important positions in their administrations.

Kumar said the pandemic hit small businesses very hard since March 2020. His own IAICC, he said would be much larger today were it not for COVID-19. He said he has traveled thousands of miles

to help small businesses apply for loans to keep their livelihoods. “They are all suffering greatly,” he told ITV Gold, especially the mom-and-pop stores and restaurants, who need help.

Knowing which businesses to invest in is a “tough call” involving risks. The individual involved has to show a commitment and their knowledge of the business, their work ethic, etc.

“You have to be concerned about everything, and have knowledge of a little bit of macroeconomics, and how to cut costs,” he said. “The right niche, right approach, and hard work,” are what pay off, he indicated.

“Business is not easy, but you need to have determination, a good plan, a good implementation plan, and you go after that and don’t back off if you are sure of what you are doing,” Kumar advised. Even if many things are right, one might fail, but that means analysing what is wrong and working on that.

Currently, irrespective of what the President does, there is a limit to its effect, because of the many

exogenous factors, like the energy constraints etc. caused by global conflicts, Kumar said, adding that all U.S. Administrations usually work with “good intentions.”

All presidents are faithful to the United States of America, despite the criticism they may hurl at each other, Kumar noted. At the same time there has to be a humanitarian approach which should also include the financial support aspect. Small businesses account for 60 percent of employment in the country, Kumar said, so governments need to pay attention to them.

Leaders should be engaged with the grassroots rather than with big organizations, he said.

In 1992, Kumar suffered an automobile accident, and had to undergo rehabilitation for a decade. He did not sue anyone, he noted, but he did get involved in the passing of the 1996 Traumatic Brain Injury Act.

His Indian tradition and philosophy he felt was what kept him from suing anyone. These ways of thinking are what should be spread more in the U.S., Kumar

opined.

Various India-U.S. pacts over the years Kumar noted, got a “main thrust” under the George W. Bush administration. “I was a little bit closer to George W. Bush because he and I worked on his father’s transition team,” he recalled.

He was also against the steps taken to impeach President Bill Clinton, who appointed Kumar to the Selective Service Board.

“I liked all the Presidents,” Kumar said, though he was not as close to President Barack Obama even though he (Obama) appointed Kumar to the California State Appeals Board.

Kumar first met President Joe Biden when many years ago when he was a Senator.

Kumar said he initially supported President Donald Trump and was on the Asian American Advisory Council during the transition, and a delegate for Trump from California. “...Trump did some good things,” but then ultimately, “he destroyed himself,” Kumar said.

The annual convention of IAICC was to be held two years ago with a meeting with a White House briefing attended by the President and Vice President, and a reception on Capitol Hill. It was postponed and is scheduled to be held in October 17, 18, and 19, in Washington, D.C., at the Ronald Reagan International Trade Center, Kumar said. Kumar is set to meet India’s Ambassador Taranjit Singh Sandhu in relation to that meeting. Ambassador I think is a man who does things and talks less. He has done good things for India and the U.S. and has been very good for Indian-Americans. He is representing India at a difficult time. I support him one hundred percent,” Kumar said.

Earlier, India announced that it will send 50,000 metric tonnes (MT) of wheat to Afghanistan

The first consignment of humanitarian aid of 2,500 tonnes of wheat from India reached Afghanistan's Jalalabad through Pakistan on February 26.

The second convoy of India's humanitarian assistance carrying 2,000 MTs of wheat left Attari, Amritsar on March 3 for Jalalabad, Afghanistan, the MEA had said.

Moreover, India sent the third consignment of 2,000 metric tonnes of wheat to Afghanistan in 40 trucks via the Attari-Wagah border on March 8.

The fourth consignment of 2,000 metric tonnes of wheat was dispatched for Afghanistan via the Attari-Wagah border on March 15.



Quad Fellowship launched for graduate STEM degrees in the US. Here's everything you need to know

100 students from members countries will be sponsored for UG courses in Sci, Tech, Engg & Math in US

The leaders of Australia, India, Japan, and the US on Tuesday launched the Quad Fellowship in Tokyo, wherein 100 students from members countries will be sponsored to study in the US for graduate degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).

"This fellowship will become a bridge that connects our four nations and it will empower us to lead and to grow so that we can resolve many of the challenges of the Indo-Pacific region and around the world," said Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida at the launch of the event.

The Quad Fellowship application is live and will remain open until June 30. The first class of Quad Fellows will arrive on campus in autumn 2023.

This program, which was first announced in September last year,

will bring together exceptional American, Japanese, Australian and Indian masters and doctoral students in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics to study in the United States.

This new fellowship will develop a network of science and technology experts committed to advancing innovation and collaboration in the private, public, and academic sectors, in their own nations and among Quad countries.

To be eligible, you need to

Be at least 18 years of age at the time of application

Be citizens or legal permanent residents of Australia, India, Japan, or the United States

Have a bachelor's degree or its equivalent in a STEM field by August 2023

Have a demonstrated record of superior academic achievement at the undergraduate level

If applicants are currently enrolled in a Master's or PhD program, they may apply if..

If applicants are currently enrolled in a Master's or PhD program, they may apply if they will be enrolled in a qualified academic program during their time as a Fellow (i.e., August 2023 - May 2024)

What you'll get as part of the Fellowship

Each Fellow will receive a one-time award of \$50,000 which can be used for tuition, research, fees, books, room and board, and related academic expenses (e.g., registration fees, research-related travel).

All Quad Fellows are eligible to apply for separate demonstrated needs-based funding of up to \$25,000 to cover costs related to completing graduate-level studies.

Three steps to making the most of the fellowship

Pre-program: Upon selection to the Quad Fellowship, Fellows Elect will have access to a variety of virtual resources and programming designed to build connections within the cohort as they navigate the graduate admissions process.

Core program: Beginning in August and extending through until the end of the academic year, Fellows will take part in a residential experience followed by virtual programming opportunities designed to deepen their understanding of topics at the intersection of STEM and society.

Alumni program: Upon graduation from the Quad Fellowship program, Senior Fellows will have access to resources that support a lifelong network across cohorts and the Quad countries.

Gun Violence Indian-Americans demand immediate action and commonsense gun reforms

The horrendous massacre at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas on May 24, 2022, that killed 19 innocent fourth graders, 9 and 10 years old, and their two teachers, and injured 17 others, shocked a nation wearied by the frequency, and parents and families of the victims in disbelief, anger, and unspeakable agony.

Ordering that flags at the White House, and federal buildings be flown at half-staff in honor of the victims, President Joe Biden addressed the nation on his return from Asia the same day

“As a nation, we have to ask: when in God’s name are we going to stand up to the gun lobby? When in God’s name will we do what we all know in our gut needs to be done?” adding “to lose a child is like having a piece of your soul ripped away. There’s a hollowness in your chest, and you feel like you’re being sucked into it and never going to be able to get out. It’s suffocating. And it’s never quite the same.”

Indian-Americans generally reacted strongly to the latest massacre.

“Enough is enough,” tweeted Vice President Kamala Harris. “As a nation, we must have the courage to take action and prevent this from ever happening again. It is long past time for our country to stand up to the gun lobby and pass reasonable gun safety laws.”

“If anyone doubted that gun violence is a public health crisis in America, yesterday was an unequivocal reminder that it most definitely is,” asserted United States Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy who has always held that view. “We owe it to the victims, the survivors, our kids, and each other to treat gun violence like the emergency it is. As a parent and as an American, I can’t fathom the depth of pain those grieving in Uvalde are feeling. ... We must do better as a country.”

“Words cannot express the heartbreaking and shocking nature of the event that occurred today,” Indian-American Judge K. P. George of Fort Bend County, Texas in a statement on May 24. “Our children go to school to learn in a caring and safe environment. The horrific actions of this single

individual, once again, serve(s) as a reminder, that even in our efforts to keep our schools safe, there are those who wish to inflict harm on the most vulnerable amongst us, our children.”

George also honored the victims with a Candlelight Vigil on May 26, at the Fort Bend County Justice Center, in Richmond, Texas along with Fort Bend County Sheriff, Eric Fagan, District Attorney Brian Middleton, and Attorney Bridgette Smith-Lawson.

Reacting to the shooting, Virginia State Senator, Ghazala Hashmi urged, “this is not the time for words. It is the time for action. It is the time for the federal government and our leaders in Congress to take steps to prevent future mass murders of innocents in our schools, grocery stores, shopping malls, houses of worship, concerts, and anywhere else that should be safe for children and families.”

The massacre has once again brought to fore the intense debate among Americans around the contentious issues of gun ownership, and second amendment rights. Mass shootings have become a perpetual issue, and gun-wielding youngsters indiscriminately taking innocent lives, have

become a constant spectacle in the US.

Republican leaders, gun lobbyists, and manufacturers of assault weapons have generally blocked any legislative efforts introduced in Congress to put an end to the epidemic of gun violence. Some have suggested arming school teachers so they can retaliate in active shooter situations.

Indian-American elected officials and candidates for political offices in Maryland and Virginia are now demanding swift actions, rather than prayers and condolences from their political leaders. They are appealing for an immediate end to the Republican filibuster in Congress, in order to advance gun control measures, and implement common sense gun reforms such as strengthening universal

background checks, prohibiting easy access to high-caliber assault weapons, and encouraging more states to implement Red Flag laws to address the issue without undermining second amendment rights guaranteed by the constitution.

“Red flag” laws, also known as Extreme Risk Protection Order laws, authorize courts to temporarily seize firearms from people who are believed to be a danger to themselves or society. Currently, 19 states and the District of Columbia have Red-Flag laws.

Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal, D-Washington, chair of the Congressional Progressive Caucus, noted that the Uvalde shooting comes just over a week after the deadly white supremacist mass shooting in Buffalo, and nearly a decade after Sandy Hook. “How many more elementary school shootings need to happen before Republicans decide to act?” adding, “year after year, the House has passed sensible gun reform legislation that would save lives. And year after year, the U.S. Senate has blocked those reforms from passing, thanks to the filibuster. It could – tomorrow- find 60 votes to pass sensible gun reforms or eliminate the filibuster, so senators are finally acting to save lives.”

Jayapal also pointed out that America has 4 percent of the world’s population but 42 percent of the world’s guns. “Yet Texas Governor (Greg) Abbott just recently signed laws loosening restrictions on gun carrying. Senator (Mitch) McConnell has led the GOP to filibuster even the most universally supported gun violence prevention laws for years. And Texas Senator (Ted) Cruz – as his own constituents try to pick up the pieces of their lives – is already waving away the call for these commonsense reforms.”

“I think all of us are just thinking about the families tonight,” Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi, D-Illinois, said. “It eerily resembles Sandy Hook and what happened there. And unfortunately, we thought that would be the catalyst for action but that did not result in any gun reform laws.”

Krishnamoorthi contends that “our inaction is recklessly leading to these horrible tragedies.” And suggested the filibuster be revoked in the U.S. Senate, a position the President has not yet supported.

Krishnamoorthi pointed out what polls have shown – that 90 per cent of gun owners support universal background checks, and that Red Flag legislation, would enable family members to intervene and ensure troubled persons do not have access to firearms.

Indian-American Democratic Gubernatorial candidate for Maryland, Ashwani Jain, told News India Times, “I am sickened that politicians and candidates will still call for ‘thoughts and prayers’ but refuse to release specific gun-safety legislation

that can prevent the constant murders of children and civilians in our schools and our communities. Enough is enough.”

Jain said that he hosted a Gun Safety workshop in 2018 after the Parkland shooting. At the end of that workshop, students ranging from age 11 to 19 made almost 200 calls to our Maryland lawmakers in support of SB 707, which would ban rapid-trigger devices in this state and keep weapons out of the hands of domestic abusers.

Calling the Texas shooting “a horrific culmination of inaction,” Latina-Indian American Democratic Candidate for Congress from Virginia 8th district, Victoria Virasingh asserted, “We need gun policy reform now. I’m running for Congress to create meaningful change. To prevent gun violence, passing stronger background check requirements to prevent people with dangerous histories from owning and carrying guns, prohibiting the sale of assault weapons and high-capacity magazines, requiring licenses before purchasing or obtaining a firearm, and enforcing Red Flag Laws, are essential.”

Alok Srivastava, executive director, of American Hindu Coalition while urging Governor Greg Abbott and Texas public officials to investigate and deliver meaningful solutions, questioned why security measures failed in the elementary school.

Srivastava told News India Times, “Texas is home to a large Hindu American population. We abhor violence, particularly against the innocent and the unarmed. But the U.S. Constitution guarantees an individual’s right

to bear arms for self-defense and to protect our loved ones and our property. So, we ask – why did the security measures in place at this Texas elementary school, including armed security officers, fail? We also ask – could an early intervention in this young man’s life by a licensed mental health professional have prevented such horrific violence?”

“We keep telling students that school is a safe place. How can we keep saying this?” questioned Sabina Malkani, an elementary school teacher in D.C. Public Schools. “Legislators need to come to the table and agree to tighten up gun laws right away. It doesn’t matter if you’re a Democrat or Republican. Fighting senseless murder cannot be about politics. It has to be about protecting the precious lives of our children. We don’t need any more thoughts and prayers. We need policy and change.”

Former Republican Candidate for Lt. Governor of Virginia, Puneet Ahluwalia, called it heart wrenching to lose loved ones “through deeds of bad horrible actors who don’t value life or freedom.”

To stop such incidents in future, Ahluwalia told News India Times, “We need to allocate more resources to protecting our kids in schools and colleges. Social media sites have to immediately notify authorities on posts which lead to these horrible tragedies and not glorify these sick individuals. Supporting our men and women in uniform and first responders with necessary training, equipment, and mental challenges is important at all times.”

NJ schools to increase security after mass shooting of students in Texas

Schools throughout New Jersey will have added security Wednesday in response to the deadly mass shooting at an elementary school in Texas on Tuesday.

Acting Attorney General Matt Platkin said state police will increase their presence at roughly 100 schools where troopers are the primary law enforcement, while county prosecutors will direct municipal departments to do the same.

An 18-year-old gunman, identified as Salvador Ramos, shot and killed 19 students and two adults Tuesday at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas. It is the deadliest school shooting since Sandy Hook

Elementary School in Connecticut a decade ago.

Ramos was killed.

"Nothing about this is normal. We do not have to accept that we live in a country where children are shot just for going to school," Platkin said in a statement. "My heart goes out to the families of the victims, and we must all do everything we can to end the epidemic of gun violence."

At a press conference on Wednesday, Gov. Phil Murphy once again pushed fellow Democrats who control the Legislature to pass another round of gun control laws, including a ban on .50-caliber rifles and requiring firearm safety training for new owners.

Murphy has signed two

rounds of gun safety measures since taking office in 2018 but he hasn't gotten enough support for his latest package of bills.

"Let's send the message now. Let's act before our nation gets lulled back into its slumber – as it was already beginning to do after the murders in Buffalo" two weeks ago, he said.

"Thoughts and prayers are worthless," he added. "Action is the only thing of value."

Paterson police stand outside John F. Kennedy High School in Paterson after it was put on lockdown Wednesday, Oct. 13, 2021. Shooting deaths rose 44% between 2019 and 2020, from 158 to 228, according to state police data. Shooting deaths have increased 12% since then, with

244 in 2021, according to the data. Since Murphy took office in 2018, gun killings have risen 33%, according to the data.

The directive from the attorney general is the second one stepping-up police presence following a mass shooting. Platkin issued one two weeks ago directing law enforcement to have a "visible presence" around houses of worship.

'End of an Era' New York's Iconic Payphone Booths Are Now Defunct

Over the decades, the phone booths have featured widely in pop culture, from comic books to Hollywood blockbusters and TV shows

New York: Marking the end of an era, New York City on Monday removed the last of its storied payphone booths, which have fallen victim to the ubiquity of free Wi-fi and cell phones in recent years.

But Superman fans can take comfort in the fact that Manhattan will keep four of the defunct booths, made famous as the impromptu changing rooms for journalist Clark Kent as he transformed into the Man of Steel.

Over the decades, the phone booths have featured widely in pop culture, from comic books to Hollywood blockbusters and TV shows. That ended Monday morning, when, in front of assembled media, Manhattan borough president -- the equivalent of the mayor -- Mark Levine had the last booth housing two Bell System payphones at the corner of 7th Avenue and 50th Street dismantled and lifted on to a flatbed truck.

Levine said on Twitter he was "on hand today to say 'Bye Bye' one last time to the famed (infamous?) NYC pay phone."

"I won't miss all the dead dial tones but gotta say I felt a twinge of nostalgia seeing it go," he added. Fixed-line payphones began disappearing from the streets of New York in the early 2000s as cell phone use spread, and then vanished even faster in the 2010s with the explosion of smartphones.

The final blow came when, in 2015, Manhattan went ahead with the installation of thousands of LinkNYC hotspots offering WiFi and free local calls.

Those new kiosks are to be gradually connected to the emerging 5G network.

"Truly the end of an era but also, hopefully, the start of a new one with more equity in technology access," said Levine, referring to neighborhoods in northern Manhattan, such as Harlem, that

are less well covered by telephone and internet networks. According to local media, Manhattan will keep four of the old-fashioned

phone booths on the Upper West Side, on West End Avenue at 66th, 90th, 100th and 101st streets.



Gujarat Titans Win IPL Title in Maiden Season

Indian Premier League, is one of India's and the cricketing world's most significant sporting events every year. This year the qualifying teams include Gujarat Titans with 20 points, Rajasthan Royals with 18 points, Lucknow Super Giants also with 18 points and Royal Challengers Bangalore with 16 points.

Gujarat Titans head coach Ashish Nehra said that while it's not easy for any team to finish on the podium in the first year of its inception, the boys "under the leadership of Hardik Pandya" had "gelled really well" to lift the IPL trophy in their opening season.

IPL newcomers Gujarat Titans defeated Rajasthan Royals by seven wickets at the Narendra Modi Stadium on May 29 to lift the prestigious IPL 2022 trophy on the back of finishing on top in the league table as well. "Yes, we've hit a six in the first year itself," said Titans skipper Hardik Pandya, adding that, "It doesn't

get bigger than this. Critics said we didn't have the strength in batting, that we lacked quality bowlers. But now that we have the trophy, it's alright."

Ashish Nehra, the first Indian coach of an IPL-winning side, said, "It's a nice feeling, but winning

the trophy notwithstanding, the more important thing is the way we played, the way we qualified. It was so very heartening to see. The first year is not easy, and all the boys did really well and gelled very well under Hardik's leadership."



David Miller, the Titans' middle-order batsman who scored an undefeated 32 off 19 balls in the title victory and was the backbone of the team's middle-order throughout the season, noted that the feeling of lifting the trophy gets enhanced if one is the underdog.

"It's been one of my most memorable IPL seasons. Being the underdogs throughout the competition, it's nice to lift the trophy and be champions," said Miller. "Batting in the middle order can be difficult but I just tried to stay calm no matter the situation and give myself the best chance. But what I've enjoyed the most this IPL season is playing spin. I've been working hard the last 3-4-5 years just getting better at spin. I never thought it was an issue, but I've really enjoyed playing spin and changed one or two things and it's definitely helped my game. Very chuffed about that," added Miller.

Shane Warne – Legendary Leg Spinner Honored

Australia's legendary leg spin bowler, Shane Warne, who untimely passed away at the very young age of 52 in March 2022 in Thailand, has an interesting story about his jersey number "23." He has been a fan of a well-known Australian football player wearing jersey number 23 since he was a child. So, when he entered into a World Cricket Test match in the year 1993, on June 4, at the age of 23, in his very first match at Manchester, England, he bowled a leg break flighted delivery to England star batsman Mike Gating, which from outside leg stump turned on the off side

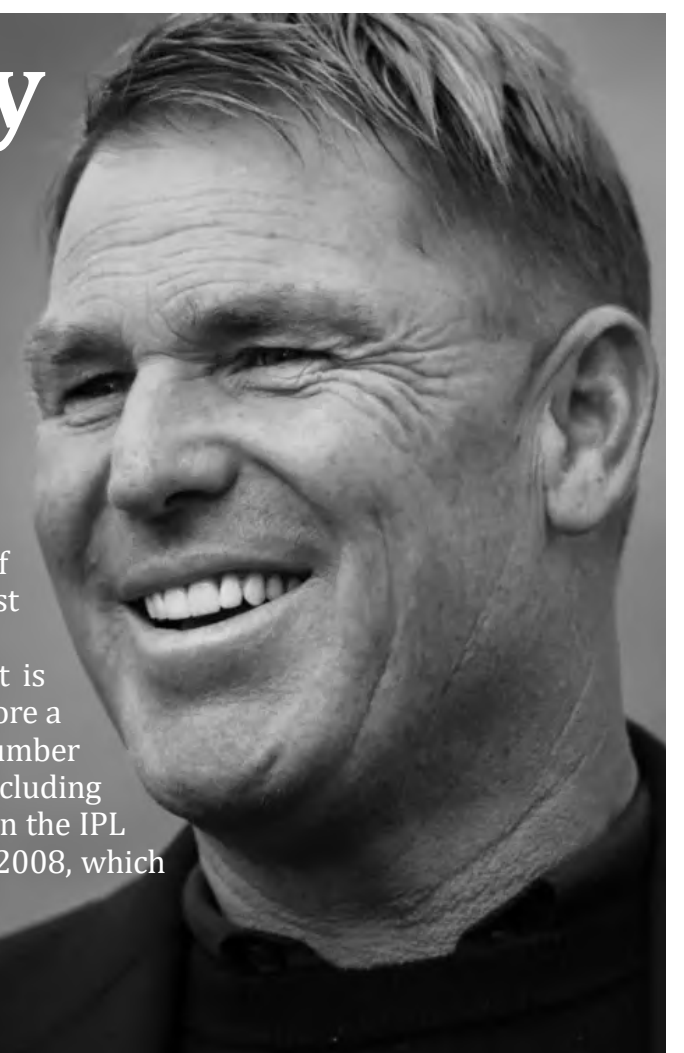
and uprooted his off stump. All players, spectators, and umpires were startled by such a 90 degree turn off the ball. Since then, it is known as the ball of the century.

Incidentally, recently at the Lords England Test Match, which is the 23rd between England and New Zealand, the match was stopped momentarily after the 23rd over for 23 seconds to pay tribute to Shane Warne, the legend. All the players and spectators clapped for 23 seconds. England's Lords Cricket Ground is well known as the Mecca of cricket, and its famous commentary box is now renamed in the memory of Shane Warne

as the "Shane Warne Commentary Box."

Shane Warne took 708 test wickets; the record was broken by Muttiah Muralitharan of Sri Lanka (800 test wickets).

The historical fact is that Shane Warne wore a jersey with a "23" number for his lifetime, including for Rajasthan Royal in the IPL inaugural season of 2008, which RR won.

Plot
An undercover cop (Ayushmann) is assigned to reign in an insurgency in the North East to ensure a peace accord between the government and the most powerful rebel group.

Analysis
The film hits the ground running, introduces its premise and characters, and we start seeing what it intends to do, wake us up to uncomfortable facts.

Anek sets forth with a well-intended message. It highlights the plight of marginalised states and people who crave for inclusivity and respect, who have been driven to violence in a bid to hold onto their individuality and yet have equal rights.

With a lot of sarcasm and symbolism, it sheds light on the diplomatic politics that plays behind the scenes.

It makes a humanitarian cry for the innocents who get embroiled and bear the brunt.

It also hits hard on our partisan mindset that judges

people as per their region or language.

The film comes across as finely crafted with many elements that shine. Excellent cinematography by Ewan Mulligan that not only delivers beautiful but often meaningful frames; excellent music score by Mangesh Dhakde that gives the right feel and impetus to the scenes; meaningful lyrics by Shakeel Azmi that convey a lot; thought provoking & tacit dialogues that could be the subject of hypothesis.

“What is peace to one could be chaos for others”

“Peace is often confused for control”

Yes ... Peace as a subject is definitely open to hypothesis!

Ayushmann delivers a solid performance with different shades, of focused cold officer and then the man who begins to think from the heart.

Kumud Mishra as the politician, Manoj Pahwa as the hardened bureaucrat and Mipham Otsam as the local school teacher, JD Chakravarty as forest officer add heft with their performances.

Andrea gives her character

an innocence that helps strike a chord.

Anubhav Sinha’s past record has been mighty impressive.

Mulk, Article 15, Thappad, all the films have not only conveyed a much-required relevant message but also were impactful and overwhelming.

Anek has its heart in the right place, does convey what it sets out to but is not as engrossing and its emotional impact gets diluted in its narration.

Somewhere amidst the intended messages of diversity, inclusivity, violence vs peace, the film loses focus because of the intensity and quantum of what Sinha wants to convey.

The narrative moves forward but seems lost in an effort to try and convey too much. With lots of diplomatic politics, gunfire, violence (in that order), the film says much, some of it obvious, some of it implicit, some of it true & moving but some of it opinionated and coloured, some of it preachy and some

of it too symbolic.

Nevertheless, there is no denying the fact that it is an important film with an important message and leaves you with a lot of food for thought. It is definitely worth a watch. Whether to watch in cinema or not would depend upon how big of a fan you are of Anubhav Sinha kind of cinema.

As the last dialogue in the film, we would say “We agree with you but...”

On the way back to his hotel after performing at a concert in Kolkata, he felt uneasy and collapsed. He was rushed to the hospital where he was declared

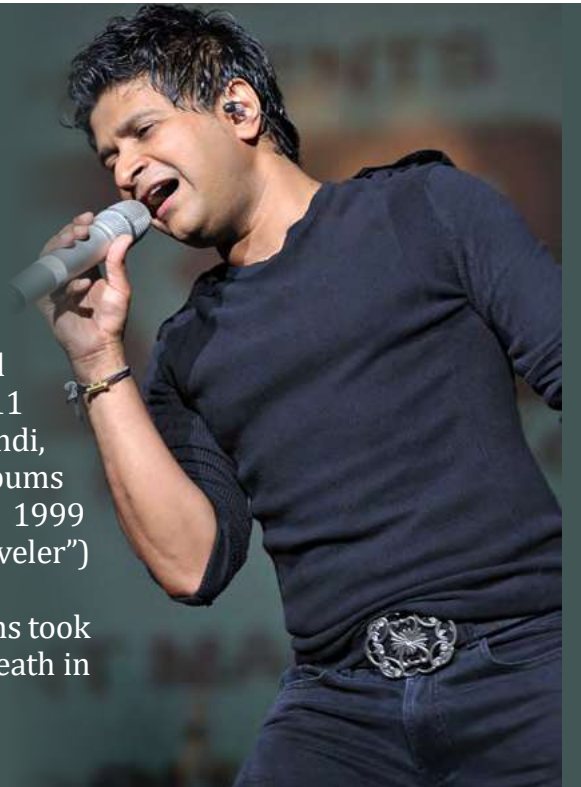
dead on arrival.

of Alfred and Mary Liotta. He attended Union High School and went on to attend the University of Miami. He studied drama and was cast in his first play, *Cabaret*.

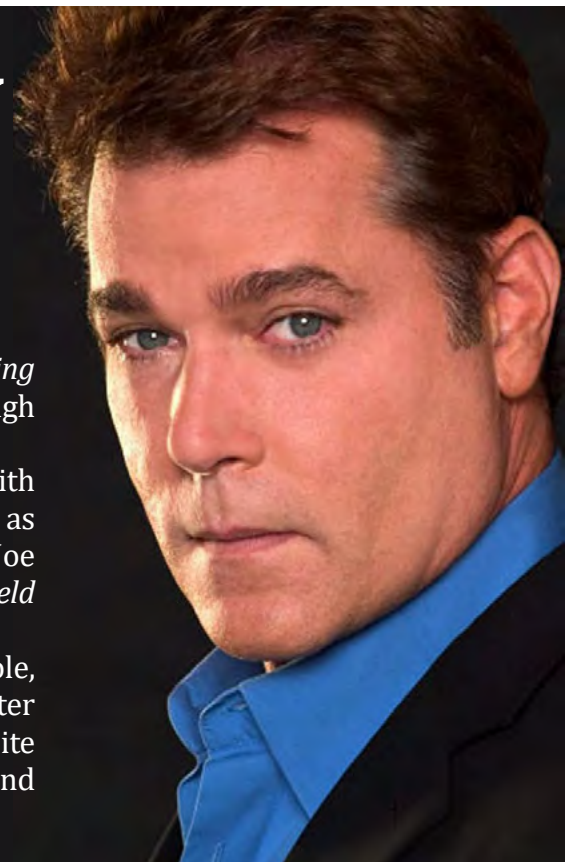
